



Clara Rivas is the General Manager of WWSI Telemundo Philadelphia, a ZGS Communications owned station, where she has served since 2008. Under her leadership the Spanish-language television station has significantly increased local viewership, expanded its reach by participating in events throughout the tri-state area, established local partnerships to benefit the Hispanic community, and introduced family events such as *Día del Niño* (Children's Day) and *La Feria de la Familia* (The Family Fair) designed to provide information and services to the Hispanic community.

Rivas began her media career in southeast Colorado where she operated an FM radio station. She oversaw the funding and construction of the station which played country music during the day and aired community focused programming for Spanish speakers in the evenings. She was awarded the prestigious Radio Crystal Award from the National Association of Broadcasters for excellence in

community service.

She joined Telemundo in 1990 where she spent the next 17 years of her career leading the stations in Denver and San Antonio. Rivas was the first Latina to manage a full-power television station in Denver and served as the General Manager of KDEN Telemundo Denver for 14 years. Rivas was a board member on several local boards including the Colorado I Have a Dream Foundation, the Denver Education and Business Coalition, the Denver YMCA Central, and the Museo de las Americas. In 2002 she was recognized by the National Hispanic Chamber of Commerce with the Corporate Advocates of the Year Award.



As Vice President and General Manager of KVDA San Antonio, where she served for 3 years from 2004-2007, Rivas was charged with revitalizing the station, rebuilding the sales force and strengthening the news operation. In two years she doubled the sales of the station. During her tenure the station dramatically expanded their participation in local grassroots events that contributed to the wellbeing of area Hispanics.

Throughout her career Rivas has been a tireless advocate for the Hispanic community. She is cognizant of the influence that television has over its audience and has championed a variety of important causes over the years including educational attainment, children's health, women's issues, immigrant rights and voter registration and engagement. She is passionate about the audience she serves using her position to create increased opportunities for Hispanics.

Rivas is a native of Colombia where she graduated from the Universidad Pontificia Bolivariana in Medellin at the top of her class with degrees in Business Administration and Finance. She resides in Philadelphia and has two grown daughters.
